Witwer told his audience to give all they could, whenever, wherever, however and to whomever they could.

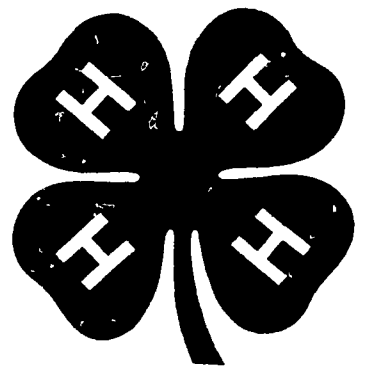

The club also discussed going to a Phillies game and formed a committee.

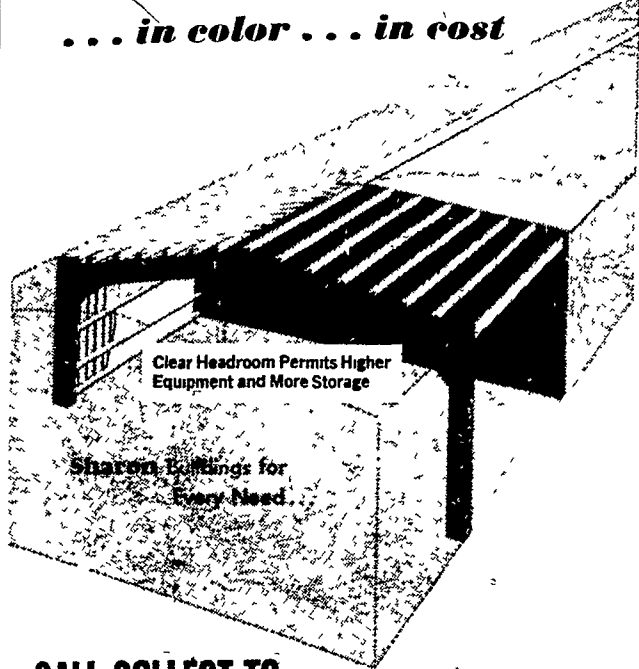
The club recently participated in Hoards Dairymen Judging contest. Fifteen of the 17 club members judged in this contest.



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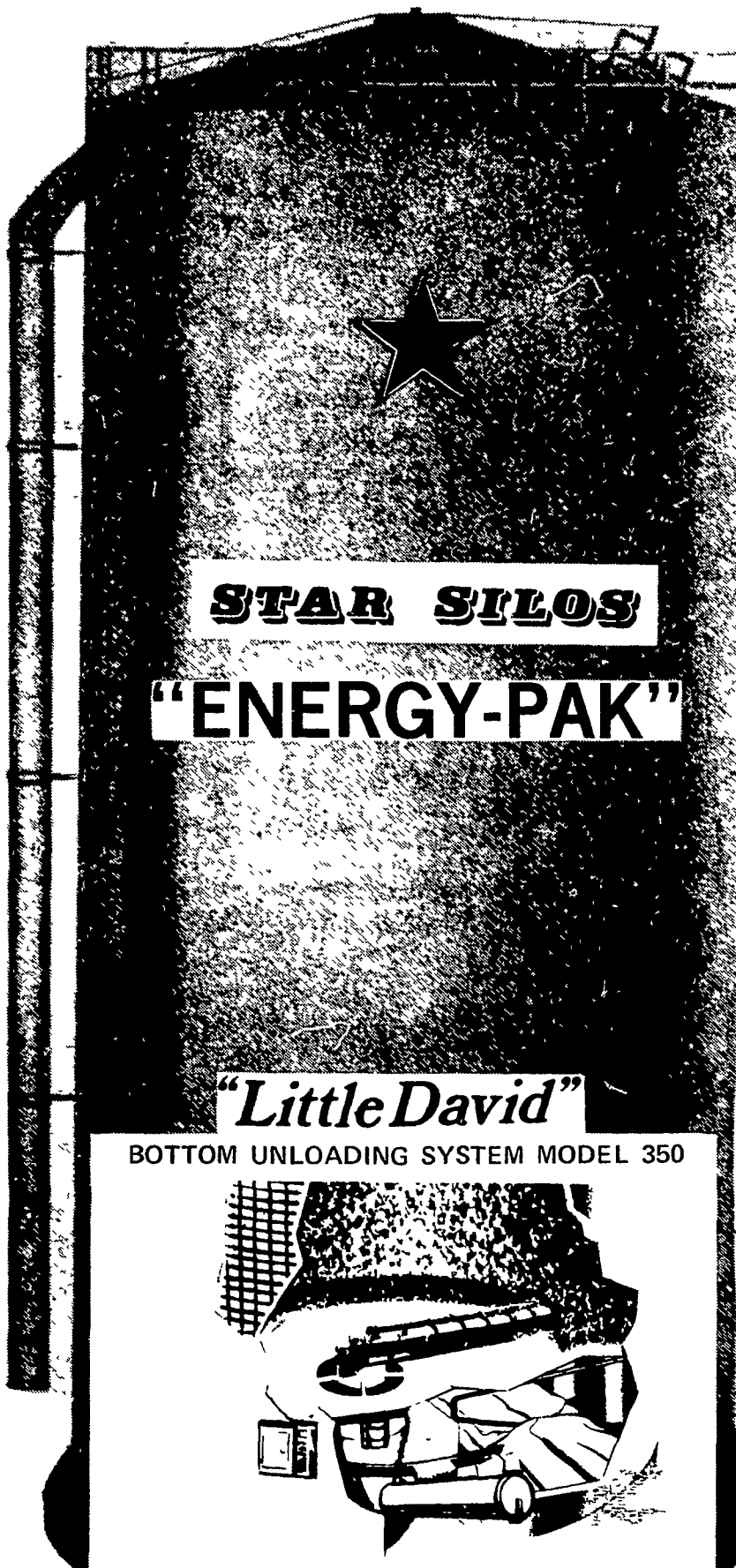
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
