Deb Stauffer was recently presented the crown and title of FFA Sweetheart by vice president Doug Snavelly at Warwick's FFA awards banquet.

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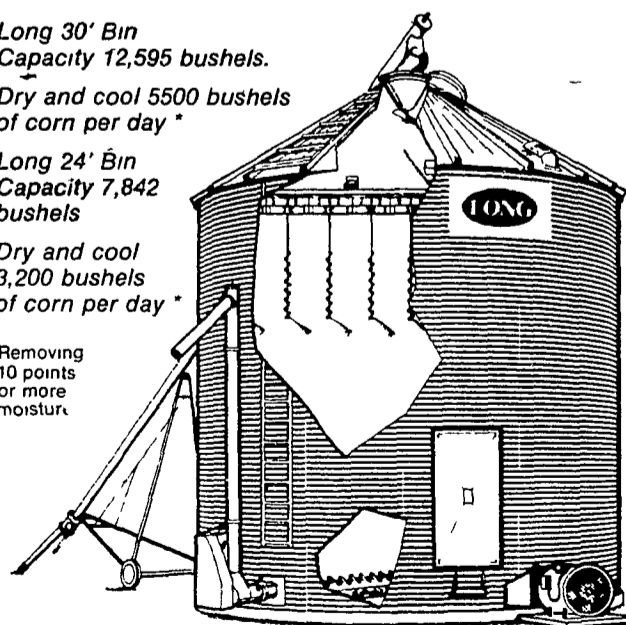
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
