

Holstein Assn. appoints director of research

BRATTLEBORO, Vt. - Dr. Lynn P. Johnson, has accepted a position as director of research for the Holstein Association of America, effective July 1, according to Zane Akins, Association executive secretary.

Johnson brings a background of research and practical experience in genetics, statistics and

computer sciences. Since 1975, he has been engaged in dairy cattle breeding research at University of Guelph, Ontario, Canada, and at Cornell University, Ithaca, New York.

In his new position for the national breed organization, Johnson will concentrate on the development of advanced technology relating to improved genetic

evaluation procedures from performance data on sires, cows, and pedigrees. He will develop best linear unbiased prediction (BLUP) procedures for PDT computation at the Holstein Association in cooperation with U.S. Department of Agriculture research scientists.

Association Executive Secretary Akins said he will

analyze and develop genetic evaluation methodology from the cooperative Holstein Association/NAAB project on linearized descriptive type trait evaluation.

While at the University of Guelph, the new type evaluation system (BLUP) for the Canadian Holstein Association was developed

and Johnson was directly involved with the national sire evaluation program for production traits.

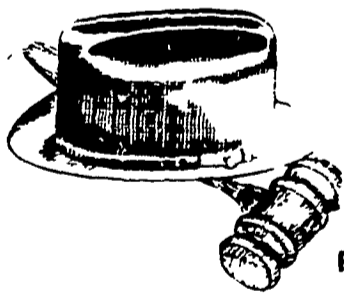
