

# State Grange public speaking contest youth winners named

HARRISBURG - Kay Burkett, Manns Choice R1, Bedford County won the Best in Show Award in the Pennsylvania State Grange Youth Department's Public Speaking Contest held recently.

The statewide contest was open to all Pennsylvania Grange members.

Two choices of subject matter were offered: "My Predictions for the Eighties" and "What I Tell My Friends About The Grange."

Burkett chose the latter topic, and won the 19-35 age group competition, as well as the Best in Show.

First place in the 14-18 age group went to Judy Paull, Lemont Furnace R1, in Bedford County. Paull's speech was also on the Grange topic.

The second place entry in the 19-35 age group was

awarded to Sandra Kerstetter, Milton R3, in Northumberland County. Mrs. Kerstetter won the competition last year.

Second place in the 14-18 age group was James L. Snyder, Jr., Camp Hill, Cumberland County.

Judges for the competition were Wanda Gallimore of Biglerville, Mrs. J. Lowry Moore, of Milton, and David Weinstock of Camp Hill.

A new addition to the Youth competition this year was the Sign-Singing Competition.

In this competition, contestants must perform a song in the hand-sign

language of the deaf. Contestants were judged on signing accuracy and quality of performance.

First place in the competition was awarded to Cheryl Stark, of Ellwood City.

Second place in the sign-singing competition went to Meecee Baker, Port Royal R2, Juniata County.

Judges for the competition were Mrs. Richard Sheetz of Altoona, and Sandy Anderson of West Springfield.

The contests took place at Logan Grange Hall in Pleasant Gap, Centre County.

# Shaw named to Pa. PennAg board

EPHRATA - F. Barry Shaw has been named to a three-year term on the board of directors of PennAg Industries Association, Ephrata.

Shaw is president of Wenger's Feed Mill, Rheems. He is a 1965 graduate of Gettysburg College, and completed graduate work in business finance at the University of Delaware.

With his election to the PennAg Board, Shaw also became a member of the education committee.

PennAg is a state-wide trade association whose members include some 400 Pennsylvania agribusiness firms. It is the oldest association of its kind in the country, having been in existence for more than a century.

# Energy project funded

WASHINGTON - The Commodity Credit Corporation (CCC) has approved a loan guarantee to Midwest Solvents, Inc., Atchinson, Kan., to finance a pilot project to convert milo and sugarcane molasses into alcohol.

The action is the fourth and final loan guarantee approved under legislation that provides for loan guarantees of up to \$15 million for a maximum of

four pilot energy projects, said Weldon Barton, director of the U.S. Department of Agriculture's Office of Energy.

Midwest Solvents requested a loan guarantee of \$15 million for their proposal to develop an alcohol distillery using fermentation technology. The project would study and develop the capability to use sweet sorghum as an alternative feedstock, in collaboration with the sweet sorghum research and field testing program at nearby Weslaco, Texas.

The three projects approved earlier include research to convert sugar cane residues to alcohols for fuel use; refine forest and agricultural residues into fuel pellets for direct burning in industrial boilers; and convert forest residues into gas, oil and charcoal for fuel and other uses.

Secretary of Agriculture Bob Bergland said at the CCC meeting today he has directed the Office of Energy to coordinate an overall appraisal of the alcohol fuel situation by early April.
