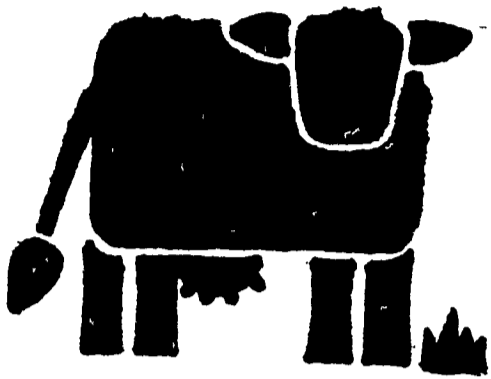


Sale Reports
