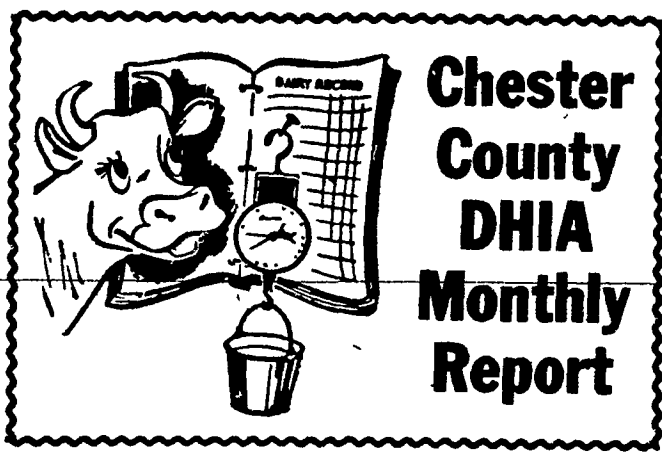

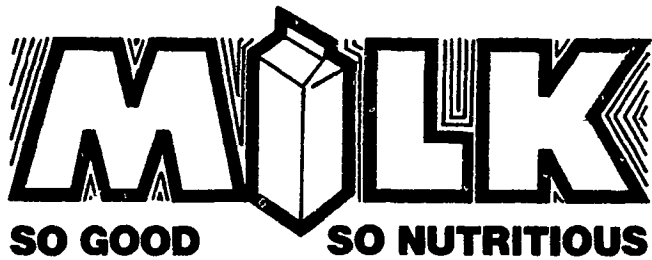
MARCH 1979

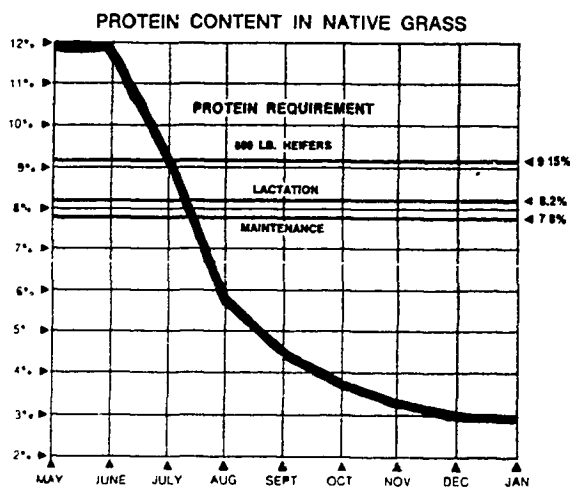
