

MARCH 1979 Cumberland County Dairy Herd Improvement records show that 8,955 cows in 148 herds were on production testing in March according to Duane G. Duncan, county agent. Of the 120 herds on DHIA, 83 herds had an average fat production of 150 pounds per cow per day for the month. During the month 101 completed their 305 day lactation with 600 lbs. of butterfat. DHIA supervisors working with the dairymen to improve efficiency include Harold Boldosser, 130 Old Gap Road, Carlisle; Diane M. Cain, Box 121, Shippensburg; and Jay Zeigler, Carlisle.
