## Delmarva Poultry

April 25, 1979

Ready-to-cook movement good on whole fryers, draggy on parts. Slaughter schedules heavy, LTL asking prices are mostly 47 cents on Plant Grade, and 48 cents on U.S. Grade A. Buying interest continues to improve for prompt shipment and for next week. Live supplies adequate. Undertone a little unsettled but mostly firm.

Current broiler/fryer negotiated prices U.S. Grade A 46-58, weighted average 47.29. Plant Grade A range 46-47, weighted average 46.51. Premium pack range 52, weighted average 52.
