## 'Keystone Klassic' expects 300 Angus heifers

**YORK** - An estimated 300 heifers exhibited by junior members of the American Angus Association from at least 15 states are expected at the Seventh Eastern Regional Junior Angus Heifer Show set for June 30 at York, Pa., reports Dick Beck, regional manager for the American Angus Association, sponsor of the event.

The show will be at the York County Fairgrounds, and has been named the "Keystone Klassic", by the members of the Pennsylvania Junior Angus Association that are co-sponsoring the event. The location of the Angus heifer show is rotated through the eastern United States each year. This is the first time it has been in Pennsylvania.

Show judge will be Gary Dameron, an Angus breeder from Lexington, Ill., and president of the Illinois Angus Association.

Activities at the show will begin officially at 9 a.m. Friday, June 29, with a free bus tour of the historic Gettysburg Battlefield. That evening there will be a meal of Angus beef roast, donated

and prepared by the Pennsylvania Angus Association, under the direction of Clair Baum, Elizabethtown and Conrad Grove, Downingtown. There will then be entertainment by the Pro-Sounds Unlimited.

The Show will begin promptly at 8:30 a.m. with welcomes by Pennsylvania Secretary of Agriculture, Penrose Hollowell; Pennsylvania Angus Association President Walter Laird, Dover; and Pennsylvania Junior Angus Association President Dale Reins of Mercer. The grand champion female is expected to be selected about mid-afternoon.

## Thomasville 4-H meets

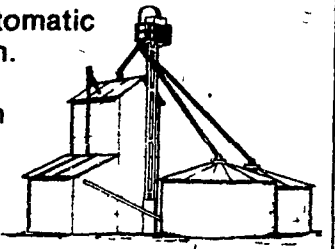
