Forage Day to be held June 19

COLLEGE PARK — Two contests, one designed to estimate the yield of a field of alfalfa, the other a corn yield growing contest, will be a part of the first Forage Day to be held June 19 at the Plum Bottom Dairy Farm in Mifflin County.

The field day, starting at 10 a.m., is sponsored by the Pennsylvania Forage and Grassland council and Cooperative Extension Service of The Pennsylvania State University. Plum Bottom Dairy Farm is located two miles northeast of Belleville on Route 655.

"Visitors will have an opportunity to study numerous efficient cropping systems," says Dr. William Stringer, Penn State agronomy specialist and chairman of the event.

These include manure application compared to

chemical fertilization; different levels of alfalfa fertilization; regrowth of alfalfa, clover, and grasses following various stages of harvesting; interseeding legumes in pastures; seeding corn in established legumes; effect of lime in controlling weeds in no-till

ventional alfalfa seeding. Penn State specialists will be stationed at various tour stops to answer questions on efficient forage crop management.

Dr. Stringer notes that, in addition to field tours, there will be a discussion of dairy system economics and inspection of the Plum Bottom Dairy Farm free stall operation.


Numerous companies who produce forage-related equipment and supplies will exhibit their products at the field day, the Penn State specialist emphasizes.

a wooded area that was harvested 20 years ago and again last year.

A representative of the Pennsylvania Department of Environmental Resources will explain what changes have occurred as a result of harvesting and what can be expected to happen to the stand in the future.

Dr. Stringer points out that wagons will transport visitors to the various centers of activity.
