Rog has been raising sheep for the past six years. Her flock consists of 20 Hampshire, comercial and black sheep ewes. She does all her own shearing, veterinarian work, fence repairing, and nutrition planning.

She is a member of the Harford County 4-H Livestock Club, Harford County Sheep Breeders Association along with the Maryland Sheep Breeders Association. She is an active junior leader in her 4-H Club and will be an assistant leader in the Fall.

Active in all phases of sheep raising, Rog does her own spinning, weaving and knitting. She said she keeps her better fleeces for herself to spin. "I really like the wool breeds, although the real value is in the meat animal" she said. With this in mind, Rog added that she would like to work with crossbreeding to get better wools on a meater animal.

4-H achievement night held




