

## Increased farm loans okayed

WASHINGTON, D.C. — The Senate Committee on Agriculture, Nutrition, and Forestry recently voted an increase of almost \$2.3 billion annually in the authority of the Farmers Home Administration (FmHA) to make loans to farmers and rural communities.

The increases in the lending ceilings recommended by the Carter Administration for FmHA programs were contained in a bill extending the loan authority for the fiscal years 1980 through 1982.

An amendment to increase the authority substantially above the levels recommended by the Administration was offered by Senators George McGovern (D-S.D.) and Bob Dole (R-Kan.). The vote was 12 to 2.

Several members of the Committee, including Chairman Herman E. Talmadge (D-Ga.), said prior to the vote the FmHA's lending authority in their States was exhausted.

As approved by the Committee, the bill (S.985)

sets a limit of \$1.6 billion for farm real estate loans, including \$1.5 billion for farm ownership, and \$1.2 billion for farm operating loans. It also sets loan limits of \$1 billion for water and waste facility loans; \$1.5 billion for industrial development loans; and \$500 million for community facility loans for rural areas.

The Carter Administration has recommended \$879.6 for real estate loans, including \$800 million for farm ownership, and \$700 million for farm operating loans. It has recommended \$700 million for water and waste facility loans; \$1 billion for industrial development loans; and \$250 million for community facility loans.

The legislation authorizes whatever funding is necessary to make loans to farmers who are hit by natural disasters.

Under the Consolidated Farm and Rural Development Act, farm and rural development lending authority for FmHA must be renewed every three years.

In another action, the Committee also reported S.670, the Rural Development and Coordination Act of 1979.

This bill would establish a rural development policy management process in the Department of Agriculture requiring an appraisal every five years of conditions, needs, problems, and opportunities for the development of rural America. The Secretary of Agriculture will be required

to submit reports to Congress every two years on progress toward achieving national rural development goals.

The bill would authorize up to \$1.5 million to establish the rural development policy management process and up to \$20 million for planning grants to State governments or State designated area planning commissions to assist in establishing and maintaining the policy management process.
