**Order 4 milk  
\$12.12 for April**

ALEXANDRIA, Va. — Middle Atlantic Order Market Administrator Joseph D. Shine recently announced an April 1979 base milk price of \$12.12 per hundredweight and an excess milk price of \$10.49. The weighted average April price was \$11.93 and the butterfat differential 13.9 cents. The April base milk price was down 15 cents from March 1979 but was \$1.41 higher than last April. The March to April drop was the result of a decline of over five percentage points in the Class I utilization percentage and a three-cent lower Class I milk price. Order No. 4 prices are announced for 3.5 per cent milk f.o.b. plant location within 55 miles of Philadelphia, Pa. and also within 75 miles from the nearer of Washington, D.C. or Baltimore, Md. There is a 6-cent direct-delivery differential applicable to producer milk received at plants located within 55 miles of Philadelphia.

Shine said that producer

receipts totaled 461.2 million pounds during April, an increase of 2.3 per cent from the previous month, on a daily basis. Class I producer milk totaled 240.3 million pounds and accounted for 52.11 per cent of total producer milk receipts during the month, down from 57.21 per cent in March and also below the 54.54 Class I utilization percentage last April. Base milk accounted for 88.45 per cent of total producer milk receipts in April, compared to 90.14 per cent in March. There were 7,271 producers supplying Order 4 handlers during the month and the average daily delivery per producer was 2,114 pounds, 101 pounds or over five per cent higher than a year earlier.

Middle Atlantic Order pool handlers reported Class I in-area milk sales of 203.2 million pounds during April, a drop of 2.6 per cent from March, after adjustment to eliminate variation due to calendar composition.
