Four day receipts 12,400, last week 12,500, a year ago 16,500.

The fed cattle trade came under severe downward pressure in a bearish, selective trade as buying interests made a determined effort to bring live prices in line with a downward plunging carcass trade. Most slaughterers were not aggressive for maximum numbers in view of the continued unfavorable cut-out ratio, and one major interest was out of the market for the entire week. The current downturn marked the third time in four weeks that closing prices were lower than the previous week with net declines of some 4.50-5.25. Slaughter steers made up approximately 49 pct with a fairly liberal percentage choice. Heifers 33 pct, much of supply good to average
