York County Farm Women Society 26 celebrated their 13th anniversary recently at the Newway Restaurant. Eighteen members and two guests attended.

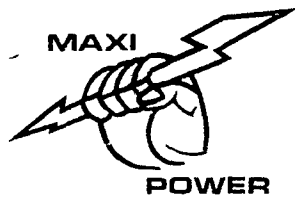

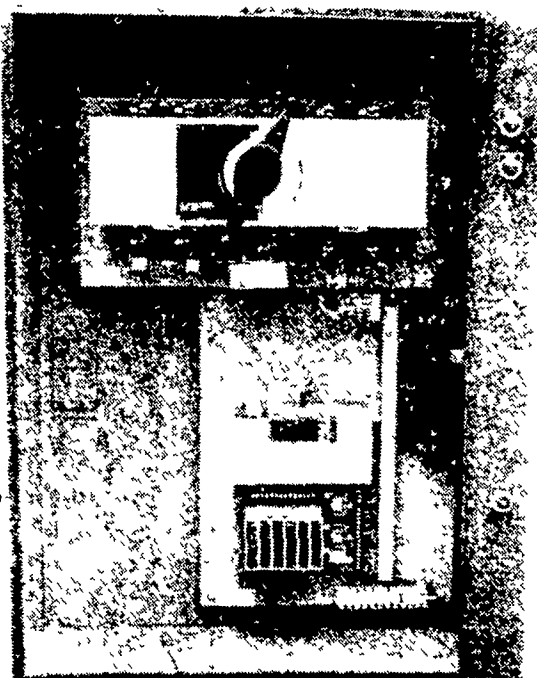

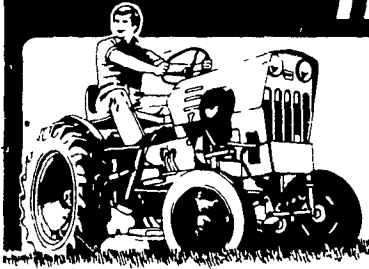
