
## **UEP** president Harry Muller predicts conglomerates will dominate egg production

ST. LOUIS, Mo.-United Egg Products (UEP) President Harry Muller was among the livestock industry leaders on hand May 8 at the annual meeting of the American Feed Manfacturers Association in St. Louis. Muller, along with representatives from the beef, broiler, dairy, swine, and turkey industries, participated in a program focusing on the 10-year future of animal agriculture.

major factors in relocation of production centers over the next decade. He foresees shifts toward grain centers close to major markets and feels that "facilities isolated from both grain producing centers and markets will no longer remain in production.'

A common concern among speakers\_was the the
