The survey, conducted by USDA's Human Nutrition Center, shows that the households, which averaged 3.1 persons spent \$47 per week on food eaten in the home, \$14 per week for food eaten away from home.

Of the money spent on food eaten away from home, \$11 per week was for meals, \$3 for snacks A total of 3500 households were involved in the survey conducted in the Spring of 1977. Some other highlights of the

A roller skating party will be held on June 18th at the Greenfield Skatarama, 7 p.m. Proceeds will benefit the exchange program.




