

Outstanding alumni, faculty, students cited at Penn State

UNIVERSITY PARK — Gamma Sigma Delta, the honor society of agriculture, cited outstanding alumni, faculty, and students during the chapter's annual banquet held recently at The Pennsylvania State University.

Alumni honored for attainments, and taken into membership, were Penrose Hollowell, Pennsylvania Secretary of Agriculture, and Merrill L. Mordan, president of the First National Bank of Honeybrook.

Hollowell, class of 1950, served from 1969 to 1977 as state director of the federal Farmers Home Administration. He owns Pennywell Farms, a 290-acre Holstein dairy operation in Ottsville, Bucks County. He was elected to

the Penn State Board of Trustees in 1977.

Mordan, class of 1949, served for several years as chairman of the agricultural committee within the Pennsylvania Bankers Association. He helped to organize the agricultural credit conference held annually at Penn State. He has been involved in many civic and community activities in Chester County.

Honored for exceptional service in research with the College of Agriculture was Dr. Robert L. Cowan, professor of animal nutrition. Honored for outstanding work as a teacher was Dr. Leon J. Johnson, associate professor of soil mineralogy. Cited for achievements in Extension work was Herbert C. Gilmore, professor of dairy science extension.

Bruce R. Knoebel, Pittsburgh, received the senior scholarship award of a watch. Knoebel is majoring in forest science. Junior citations of \$50 each went to James T. Elwell of Harwinton, Ct., majoring in animal bioscience; and to Lori F. Fehr of Pine Grove, majoring in horticulture.

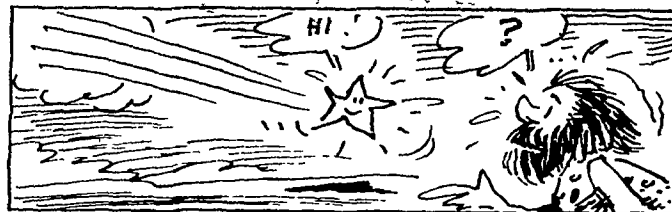

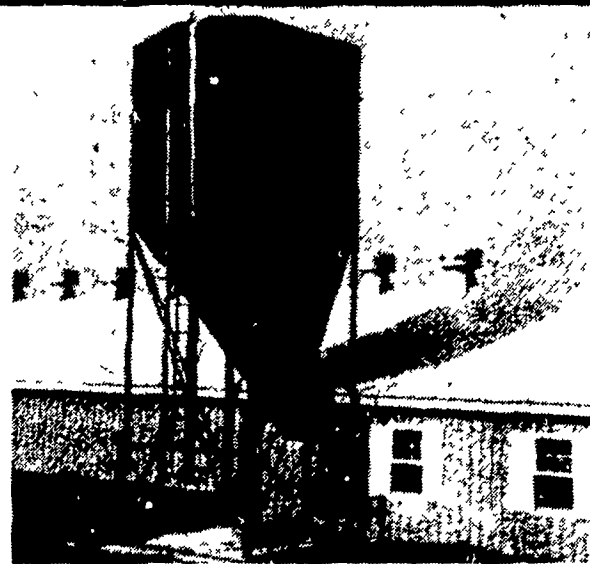

Poultry science graduate scholarships announced

NEWARK, Del. — A new graduate level scholarship has been established for students majoring in poultry science in the College of Agricultural Sciences at the University of Delaware. According to Dr. John K. Rosenberger, chairperson of the department of animal science and agricultural

biochemistry, the scholarship has been made available through a grant from the Hubbard Farms Charitable Foundation of Walpole, New Hampshire.

The amount of the scholarship for the 1979-1980 academic year will be \$1000. It will be made available on an equal opportunity basis to

a recipient selected on the basis of merit by a committee within the department.

In announcing the scholarship, Rosenberger expressed his appreciation for the generosity of the donor, noting that Hubbard Farms is a poultry breeding and research farm whose

famous Hubbard line birds have provided the genetic stock used by much of the Delmarva broiler industry.

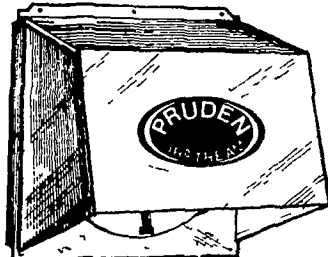

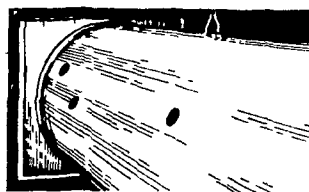

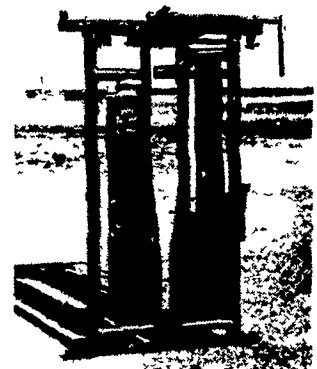
