



# Chester County DHIA Monthly Report

APRIL 1979

Melvin Stoltzfus had the high butterfat cow for records completed last month. His "Senator," a 7-year old Holstein, checked in with 1041 pounds of butterfat, derived from 22,266 pounds of milk testing 4.7 per cent butterfat. The high milk producer is "Sherry," owned by John S. Stoltzfus. She produced 22,347 pounds of milk with a 4.0 per cent test and 896 pounds of butterfat.
