Lawrence E. and Doris F. Wilkinson

Lawrence and Doris Wilkinson operate a 785-acre dairy farm in Gettysburg, Pa. They are members of the Biglerville Local of Inter-State's District 24. Both Lawrence and Doris graduated from Kennett High School in 1963.

On Getty Acres farm, the Wilkinsons' herd consists of 160 Holstein milking cows and 145 head of young stock with an average milk production of 15,300 lbs.

The Wilkinsons grow 291 acres of corn, 233 acres of hay and 60 acres of small grains. The Wilkinsons are members of the Bethel Mennonite Church. Lawrence is a DHIA director, 4-H leader for Tractor Safety Course, a past member of the Adams County Farmers Association.

Produce firm fails to satisfy PACA award

PATCHOGUE N.Y. - Cory Farms, Inc., Patchogue, N.Y., failed to pay a reparation award issued by the U.S. Department of Agriculture (USDA). The award in the amount of \$2552, was issued in favor of a Florida seller for a truckload of watermelons shipped in June 1978.

The firm admitted liability, and USDA ordered payment of the amount claimed due.

The firm, according to marketing specialists of

USDA's Agricultural Marketing Service, may not conduct business under PACA unless USDA approval is granted. In addition, Theodore William Korytowski and Helen Stella Korytowski—the firm's officers, directors, and major stockholders—may not be employed by, or affiliated with, a PACA licensee without USDA approval.

PACA establishes a code of good business conduct for the produce industry. Under its regulations, all interstate

traders in fresh and frozen fruits and vegetables must be licensed by USDA, which

is authorized to suspend or revoke a trader's license for violating the Act.

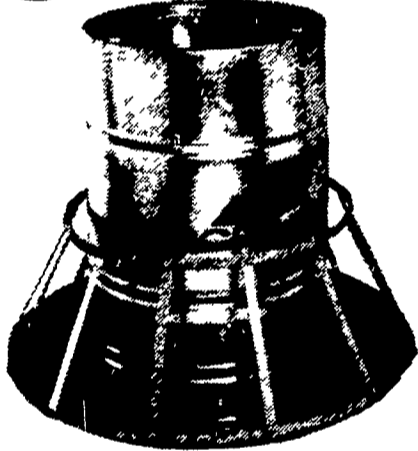

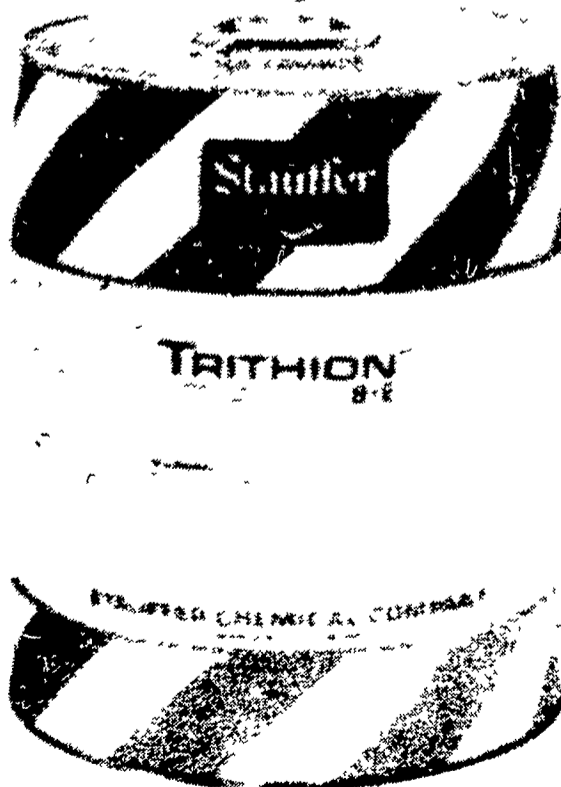
