The first runner-up was Patty Jenkins, daughter of Mr. and Mrs. William Jenkins, Toughkenamon. The family raises Jerseys.


Reserve corn released

WASHINGTON, D.C. Corn in the farmer-owned reserve was released for redemption, effective immediately, by John Goodwin, acting executive vice president of the Commodity Credit Corporation (CCC). Farmers may sell their reserve corn after repaying their CCC price support loans.

Release of the reserve does not require farmers to redeem or sell their grain at this time.

Goodwin said the national average market price for corn has reached \$2.50 per bushel. The price level at which the commodity is released from the reserve is 125 per cent of the \$2.00 national loan rate or \$2.50 per bushel. More than 730 million bushel of corn are in the reserve.

Farmers with grain in the eserve receive storage




