Compared with last week's close, slaughter steers steady to 50 lower. Slaughter heifers weak to 50, instances 1.00 lower. Cows mostly steady. Bulls firm to 1.00 higher. Receipts about 70 per cent slaughter steers, 25 per cent slaughter heifers, balance mainly cows. Large share steer receipts weighing 1150-1250 lbs.

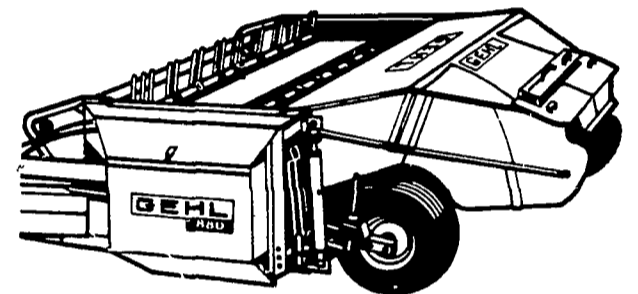
