

Oats and barley called from grain reserve

WASHINGTON, D.C. — National average prices have reached \$1.44 per bushel for oats and \$2.31 per bushel for barley, levels requiring the U.S. Department of Agriculture to call these commodities from the farmer-owned grain reserve, according to an announcement last week by Under Secretary of Agriculture Dale E. Hathaway.

Calling loans on oats and barley in the reserve means that farmers have 30 days from the date of notification

of the call to repay their reserve loans. Under the grain reserve program, farmers own the commodities and are not required to sell their grain. If they do not repay the loan, however, they must forfeit the grain to the Commodity Credit Corporation (CCC). About 38 million bushels of oats and 40 million bushels of barley are in the farmer-owned reserve.

In a news conference last week Hathaway called attention to the current snarl in truck and rail trans-

portation and said that prior to the repayment deadline on a call, an assessment would be made on a county-by-county basis to determine if it is physically possible for a farmer to deliver the commodity. In areas where there is no commercial storage or adequate transportation, Hathaway said CCC would delay issuance of delivery orders to farmers for at least 30 days after the normal 30 day delivery or repayment period.

If the storage and/or transportation problem(s) continue, an assessment of the situation will be made every 30 days to determine if delivery notices can be issued in the counties involved. These delays in delivery or repayment will apply to farm-stored loans only; warehouse-stored loans will be forfeited after 30 days unless they are repaid before the cut-off date. County offices of the Agricultural Stabilization and Conservation Service

(ASCS) will make the assessment, Hathaway said. ASCS county offices will officially notify producers when their grain has been called and the date by which the loan must be redeemed.

Under the farmer-owned grain reserve program, established by Congress in the Food and Agriculture Act of 1977 and designed to stabilize marketing, farmers are eligible to place wheat and feed grains into a reserve during periods of low prices. In return, farmers receive Commodity Credit Corporation (CCC) price support loans on the grain in reserve as well as annual storage payments. If prices rise to the "release" level, farmers can repay the loan and market the crop without incurring a penalty.

The release level was reached on May 11 for oats and June 5 for barley.

Farmers holding these commodities in the reserve were then free to repay their loan and sell or store the commodities as they wished.

The call of oats and barley under the reserve means that prices have risen to the point where farmers must repay the price support loan or forfeit the commodity to CCC.

The call level on feed grains is 140 per cent of the national average loan rate. Data used by CCC in determining the call level includes a daily report by the Agricultural Marketing Service (AMS) which shows prices at selected markets, and a month-end Economics, Statistics and Cooperatives Service (ESCS) report of prices received by farmers showing the previous month's average price and the current mid-month price.
