

Charolais Field Day to be July 13-14

CLEAR SPRING, Md. — LeRoy Myers, president of the Colonial Charolais Association, has announced that the 1979 Colonial Field Day to be held on July 13 and July 14. The host farm will be Myers Charolais Farm, located in Clear Spring, Maryland, seven miles west of Hagerstown, Maryland, on U. S. Route 40.

Friday's field day activities, starting at 10 a.m.

continuing through lunch until 5:30 p.m., will include weight guessing, timed-fitting, a judging contest including classes of heifers, bulls and steers, cow-calf matchup, the Colonial Charolais Queen contest beginning at 4 p.m., and other events of interest for all. Following the Queen's contest, a beef barbeque will be served at 6 p.m. During the meal, awards will be

presented to the winners of the day's events.

On Friday evening, July 13, at 7 p.m. the Colonial Charolais Association will hold their annual Colonial Invitational. This year the sale will consist of 50 head from 26 breeders representing 11 states.

There will be four bulls and 46 females in the sale. For the first time for any

sale ever held in the Charolais breed, all of the females will be heifers, both open and bred heifers. They will come from the leading herds in all the northeastern United States.

The junior members will have the prerogative to buy a heifer on Friday evening and show her on Saturday at the first Colonial Junior Show. For full details and a

Saturday's activities will begin at 10 a.m. with a seminar conducted by the American International Charolais Association, followed by lunch at noon. The first Colonial Junior Heifer Show will begin at 12:30 p.m. This show is open

to any junior 9-21 yrs. old. Heifers will be placed in equal class divisions according to age. Judge for the show is John Mitchel, manager of Wesson Charolais, Koshkonong, Missouri. All cattle should be on the grounds by 2:00 p.m. August 2 and remain until 4:00 p.m. August 4. Milking cows may be taken home right after the show again this year.

The Judge this year is Donald Trimble from Peach Bottom.

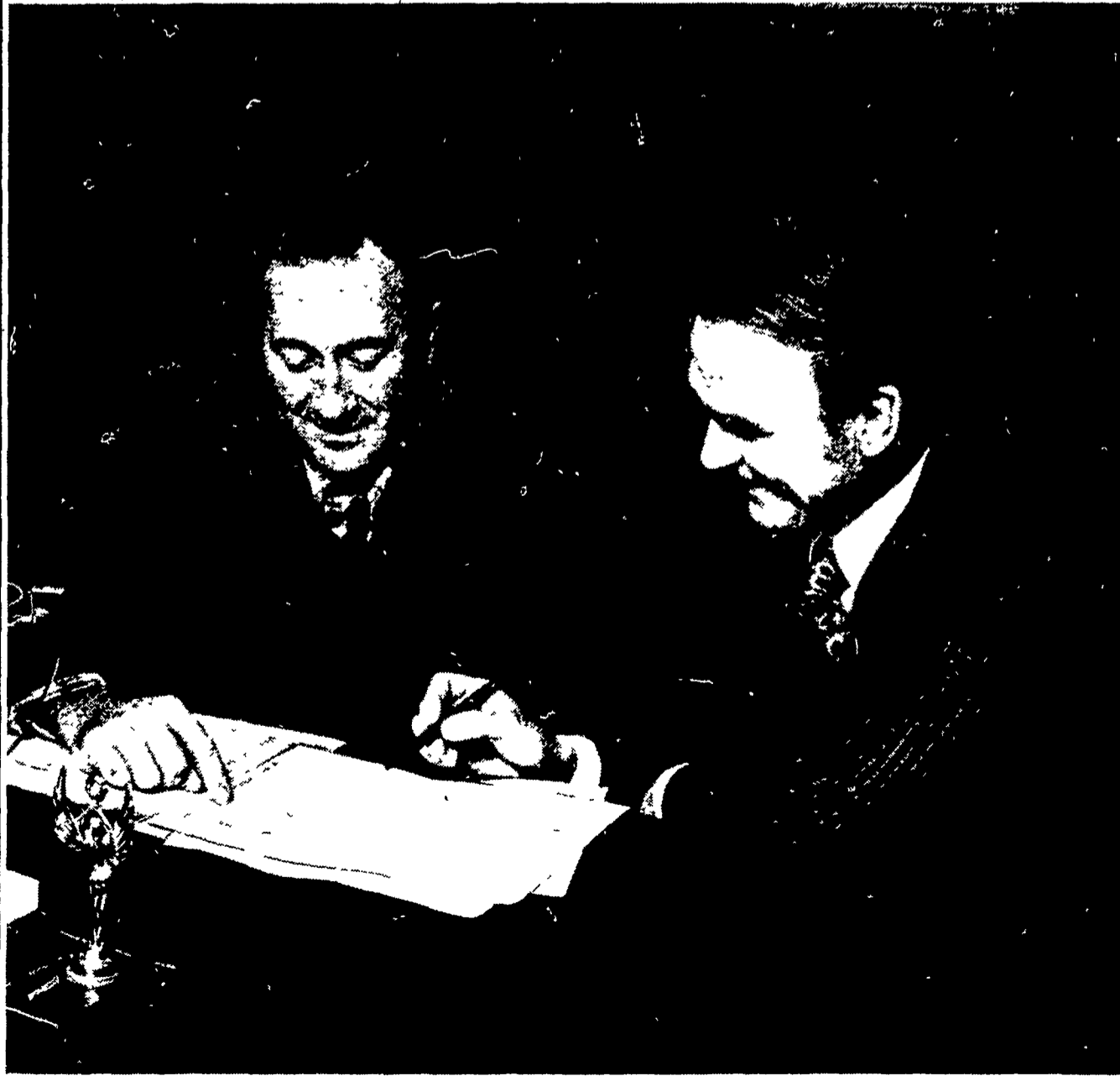
