Mandatory union stifles growth

HARRISBURG - While Pennsylvania is lagging farther and farther behind in key economic indicators, Right to Work states are forging ahead, Pennsylvanians for Right to Work President Albin W. Simokat declared here Wednesday.

Simokat released the latest U.S. Department of Labor statistics which show that between 1967 and 1977 the 20 Right to Work states gained over one million manufacturing jobs. The 30 states which, like Pennsylvania, permit compulsory unionism lost 889,800. In percentage terms, the Right to Work states' average net gain was 22.1 per cent, while the compulsory unionism states' average loss was 6.0 per cent.


