**Adams County Beef Association
schedules bi-monthly meetings**

FAIRFIELD - The Adams County Beef Producers Association is an organization dedicated to the advancement and improvement of the beef industry in south-central Pennsylvania. Bi-monthly meetings are held on the second Tuesday at the Adams County Extension Office. The next meeting will be on August 14 at 7:30 p.m. Meetings include a program of interest to beef producers.

Recently, Harold Strong of Todd Hybrid Sales Inc. presented a slide program to

the Association on haychew, which is a good pasture or hay crop alternative because of its quick growth, palatability and its fine stems.

Haychew may be planted after corn is planted, in 70 degree soil for germination. Soil should be the same pH as for corn. Haychew may be cut for forage within two weeks after germination, provided that it is 24 inches tall, for the proper prussic acid level. The ideal height for hay cutting is 40 inches, when for the first cutting, it yields 16 per cent protein. It

should not be grazed after frost.

The Adams County Beef Producers Association will hold its fourth annual calf sale on October 25th at South Mountain Fairgrounds, Arendtsville. This is a graded sale of pre-conditioned calves. N.Y. firm's license revoked

NEW YORK, N.Y. — Stanley Zimmerman, Howard Zimmerman, and Harry Leader, a partnership doing business as Zimmerman, Zimmerman, & Leader, of Scarsdale, New York, has had their Perishable Agricultural Commodities Act license revoked for failing to make full payment promptly for produce worth \$61,154 and failing to remit net proceeds of \$8,159 for the sale of produce on consignment. PACA, administered by U.S. Department of Agriculture officials, establishes a code of good business conduct for the produce industry.

The firm may not conduct business under PACA until June 15, 1981, and then only if a PACA license is obtained. Each partner may not be employed by any PACA

licensee until June 15, 1980, and then only if the employer posts a surety bond and USDA approves.

Officials with the department's Agricultural Marketing Service charged the firm with failing to pay promptly for produce worth \$64,122 purchased from August 1975 through March 1976. The department ruled that based on the evidence,

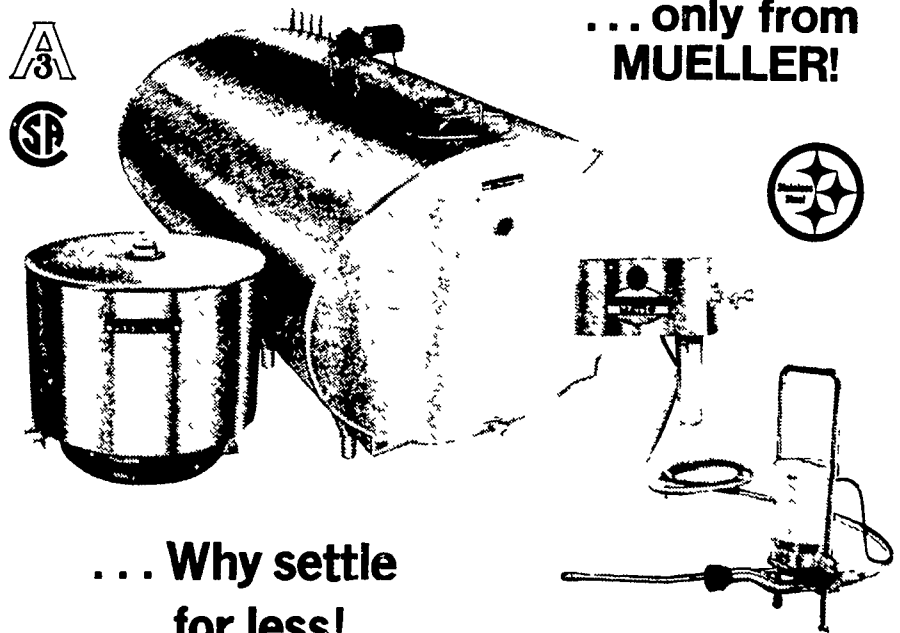
the firm had committed willful, repeated, and flagrant violations of the act and ordered its PACA license revoked.

Under PACA, all interstate traders in fresh and frozen fruits and vegetables must be licensed by USDA. USDA is authorized to suspend or revoke a trader's license for violating the act.
