Hay Creek Festival reaffirms the good life



Each day of the festival, the Hay Creek Valley Historical Association will present the good life as it was in this southern Berks area. The festival will take place at the Geigertown Fire Company on Friday 8 p.m. to 11 p.m., Saturday 10 a.m. to 8 p.m., and Sunday 10 a.m. to 5 p.m.

The Fall Festival is not a nostalgic look back, rather it is a reaffirmation of the good life in the Hay Creek Valley and its calm, quiet lifestyle.

To the projected 12,000 people who will be visiting the festival, the word progress will take on a new meaning: today's impersonal conveniences and poor services replacing yesteryear's pride and skill of craftsmanship in addition to the security of being self sufficient.
