**CARLISLE** — Champions in the Holstein and Jersey dairy cow breeds were chosen Tuesday night at the Carlisle Fair as the first of the livestock competitions got underway.

Christine Gitt, 17, showing with her father, Robert, showed the grand champion black and white. The 17 year old young lady from Littlestown R2, showed Janibo Dian Elevation, a three year old to the top spot in the ring. The cow had previously

been placed at the first place three year old at last year's Pa. Farm Show, and the first place three year old at the Shippensburg Fair.

In the Jersey division, Mildred Seeds, Top-o-Hill Farms, Downingtown, exhibited the champion animal, Merry Jingo of Top-o-Hill.

The Jersey was a two year old, who first placed first in the senior 2 year old class. She had previously been named the grand champion at the Goshen and Kim-

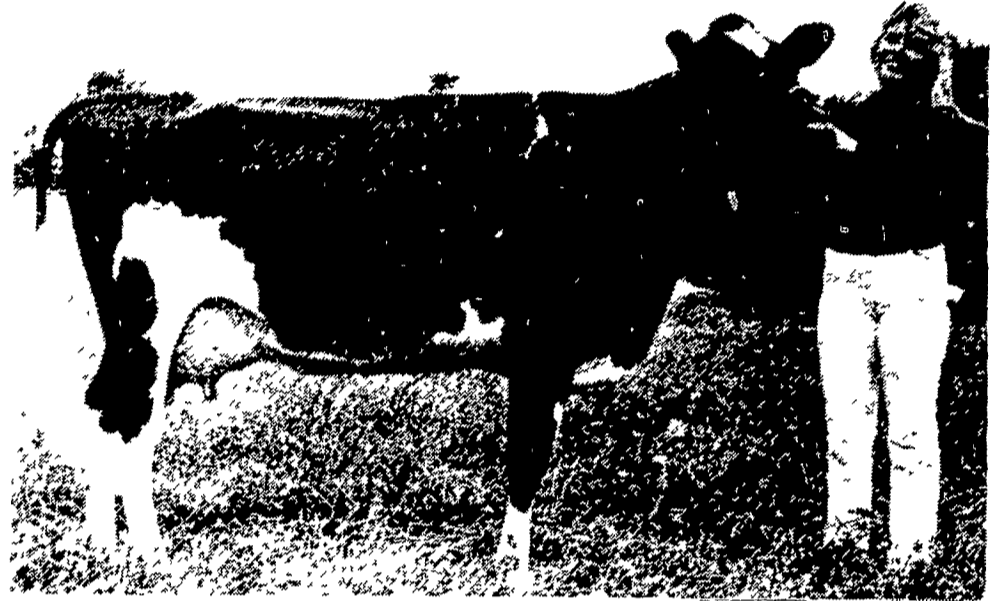
