Winners chosen at rabbit and poultry show

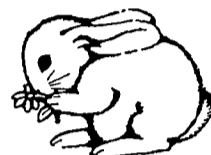

The rabbit show was judged by Mrs. Mary Battista, a former 4-H Rabbit Club leader, from Neshanic Station.







