

Meat pricing consultation panel named

NEW YORK, N.Y. — Secretary of Agriculture Bob Bergland has appointed a panel to work with the meat industry to improve price reporting services.

Acting on recommendations of the Meat Pricing Task Force, Bergland said if problems of

meat pricing and price reporting are not resolved by voluntary action of the industry, the department "must and will consider other remedies."

The panel, known as the Meat Pricing Consultation and Evaluation Group, will be headed by P. R. Smith,

assistant secretary for marketing and transportation services. The group will coordinate the department efforts and help implement recommendations made June 15 by the Meat Pricing Task Force.

The task force recommended that:

—The meat industry be encouraged to proceed with the development of an electronic meat marketing system.

—Price reporting services be encouraged to continue reporting packer-to-packer prices in fullest extent possible to increase the price base for price reporting.

—Packers and Stockyards of the department's Agricultural Marketing Service cooperate closely with the Commodity Futures Trading Commission in monitoring live cattle futures trading.

—Formula trading not be banned and mandatory price reporting should be avoided.

—The department monitor new electronic systems as it monitors other livestock and meat market systems.

—The department make periodic surveys to monitor price and procurement related activities similar to the analysis done for the "Beef Pricing Report."

—The department, with industry and consumer representatives conduct an in-depth study of the adequacy of present reporting of both carcasses and fabricated beef and establish standards of adequate reporting of a thin market.

Bergland called for a review by the consultation and evaluation group in July, 1980, to measure results of the department's efforts to get voluntary industry cooperation in correcting the problems. He said the industries "must assume their full share of obligation in taking all possible corrective actions. The task force has wisely recommended this review process and it is my observation that this review should be strongly emphasized and even expanded beyond the recommendation of the task force."
