

## Farmers Assoc. supports foreign assistance

READING—The Berks County Farmers Association has told the Presidential Commission on World Hunger that it supports well-designed foreign assistance programs.

Jack Kooker, Berks County president, said these programs not only help other countries deal with immediate problems but also contribute to the economies growth which results in increased trade and market, including increased U.S. agricultural exports.

In a recent letter to the Commission, Kooker said a streamlining of public law 480 (Food for Peace) is both necessary and desirable in order to carry out the objective of the program. He said provisions of the law enacted in 1954 have been encumbered by numerous amendments that make

administration of the program very complex and slow moving.

He told the Commission that Berks County Farmers Assoc. supports credit to developing countries that wish to expand their grain storage capacity or otherwise strengthen their marketing infrastructure. "We believe that such

assistance, if implemented, would enable foreign countries to better meet their food security."

Kooker explained that Berks County Farmers Assoc. opposes the accumulation of reserve stocks that are to be held or controlled by the U.S. government or some type of international organization. He said farmers wait to

have an opportunity to recover from depressed grain prices without being confronted with government action, such as stock releases, whenever prices begin to recover.

Berks County Farmers Association supports an international fund for the purchases of commodities for food assistance, he added.

While believing that multilateral program, such as the World Food program, have contributed significantly to alleviating hunger and malnutrition, Kooker said these programs should be monitored and examined for their effectiveness.

Kooker called for more effective implementation of the provisions of the famine prevention act by utilizing the resources of the land grant universities in helping

developing nations in agricultural and economics development.

On developing a national food policy, Kooker said, "Private groups, including farm organizations, should have a major role in shaping food policy. These groups were utilized in this way for the Geneva trade talks."

Kooker also encouraged the Commission to examine the special relationship between population growth and famine relief.

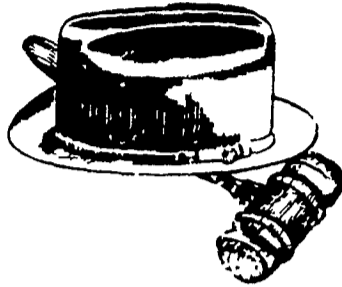
