

Safety seminar set for wood stove industry

NEWARK, Del. - As thousands of people in the Northeast move to wood as a heating fuel, professionals associated with the wood burning industry need to increase their understanding of the principles of wood burning to keep up with consumer demand for sound information.

The Cooperative Extension Service of Delaware and Maryland has designed a seminar for wood stove manufacturers, retailers, salespeople, contractors, building inspectors, insurance personnel, chimney sweeps, fire safety educators, state foresters, energy officials, fire marshals, and those employed in related industries.

The Delmarva Wood Stove Safety Seminar will be held

on September 12, 1979, at the Sheraton Inn in Dover, Del. It will cover recommended practices for safe installation and operation; chimneys and the creosote problem; and principles and economics of heating with wood.

Wood stove and chimney manufacturers, energy officials, and representatives of the insurance industry and Underwriters Laboratories will discuss various aspects of the future of wood burning.

Featured speaker will be Dr. Jay Shelton, author of *The Woodburners Encyclopedia*. Dr. Shelton is an independent wood heating consultant, researcher, lecturer and author. A Harvard graduate with a Ph.D. in physics from the

University of California at Berkeley, he started measuring wood stove efficiency in 1975. As a consultant he supplies information about performance, design and safety aspects of wood heating systems to consumers, industry and government.

Shelton belongs to the American Society of Heating, Refrigeration and Air-Conditioning Engineers; the Fireplace Institute Engineering Committee; and NFPA 211 Task Force on wood stove installation. He also serves on the board of directors of the National Solid Fuel Traders Association.

Wood stoves, chimneys and other products pertaining to the wood heating industry will also be displayed at the Seminar.
