Flickinger wins in state driving contest

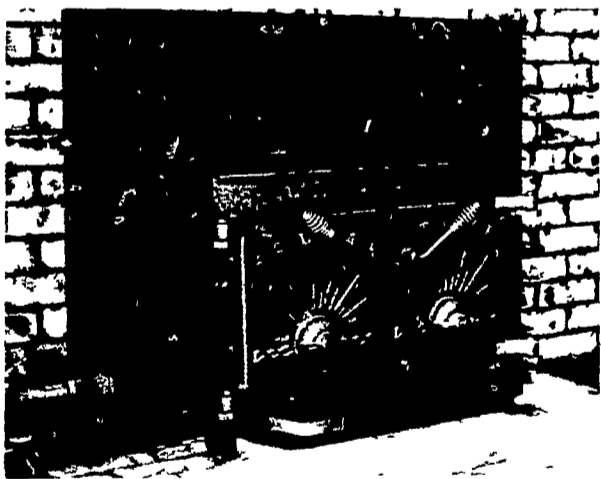
GETTYSBURG — Adams County 4-H member, Gary Flickinger, son of Mr. & Mrs. Richard Flickinger, Gettysburg, placed second in the State 4-H Tractor Driving Contest. Seven 4-H members from across the state participated in this state contest, held at Ag Progress Days at Penn State University.

Gary was selected as county 4-H tractor driver in the spring. The county and state tractor driving contest involves a demonstration of driving skills and knowledge of maintenance procedures. Driving skills include: 1) inspection and safe operation of tractor; 2) hitching a two wheel manure spreader, driving it through an

obstacle course and backing the spreader into a stall; and 3) hitching a wagon and backing it into a stall. A written examination, as well as parts identification and trouble shooting examination are utilized to determine the members knowledge of maintenance procedures.

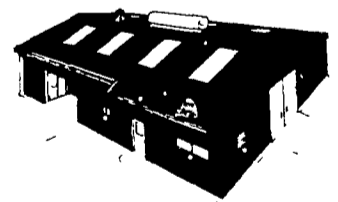
