Nest Run Eggs

Prices are from Egg Clearinghouse, Inc., (ECI) Durham, N.H. and reflect trading prices for gradable nest run eggs (GNR) on ECI, a nationwide trading center for producers, packers and marketers. GNR eggs are classified by weight in 30-dozen cases, and traded in lots of either 300 or 750 cases. Prices are FOB buyers dock, and are computed Tuesday and Thursday of each week. August 29, 1979

Prices were unchanged to higher on mediums; balance unchanged. Cartoned egg demand irregular. Offerings on jumbos and extra large barely adequate, large and mediums irregular, smalls ample. Trade sentiment unsettled.

Prices to retailers: Sales to volume buyers, consumer grades white eggs in cartons, delivered: store door.

Baltimore Eggs

August 29, 1979

Prices unchanged to one cent higher on mediums. Demand is irregular. Supplies are barely adequate on large sizes, mediums are adequate but clearing easily. Occasionally inquiry noted for class 1's went unfilled.

Delmarva Poultry

August 29, 1979

Ready-to-cook movement remains generally fair although less aggressive in some quarters than in previous days. Slaughter schedules are moderately heavy. Today's lit. asking prices were generally 40 cents on plant grade and 41 cents on US Grade A. Live supplies are adequate at weights in a wide but generally desirable range. Undertone generally steady.

Current broiler/fryer negotiated prices for immediate delivery includes mostly multiple-drop shipments to New York City from Delmarva.
