

Parents can aid school success

MEDIA - Success in school begins at home, according to Gretz C. Vairo, Delaware County extension home economist. There are concepts that parents should be teaching a child at home before he or she enters school. The first six years of life are too important in a child's emotional and intellectual development to leave to chance. She offers these suggestions in teaching young children:

- * Children need experience in talking and listening. Speak to children in sentences and expect

them to answer in full sentences as soon as they are capable. Looking at books together provides endless opportunities for questions and discussions.

- * Teach children the colors, shapes and names of objects wherever you go.

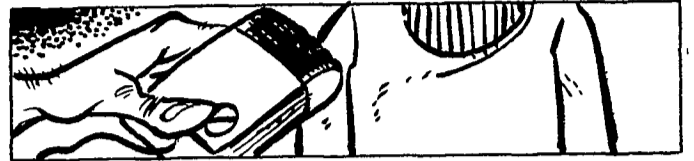
- * Begin in the very early years, during bath time, to teach the names of the parts of the body. You might play the old favorite game "Simon Says." And children will enjoy following the commands: Simon says, "Touch your chin" or Simon

says, "Touch your ankle" and so on.

* Much teaching of language can be done when you are busy doing other things—shopping together or cleaning house. But it's important to set aside a regular reading time even before a child understands

many words. Let your child accompany you to the library, and when possible, let him select his own books and learn to care for them.

* A stimulating environment in the preschool years can help a child retain an eagerness and enthusiasm for school.
