It was announced that Fulton Grange will host the fall meeting of the Lancaster County Pomona Grange today, September 15, 8 p.m. when election of officers will be held.

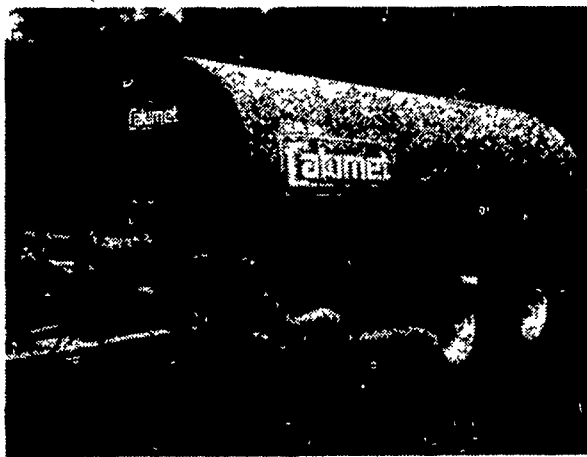
A communication was read from Christine Erb, IFYE student for Lancaster County, who is in Japan.

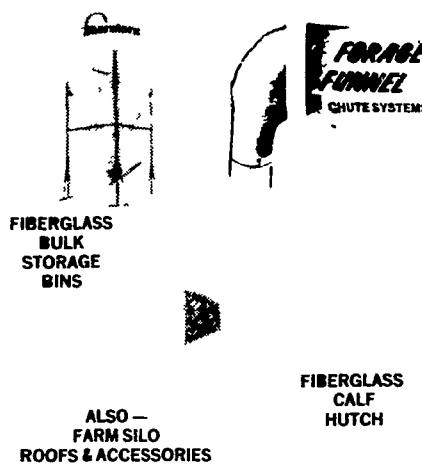

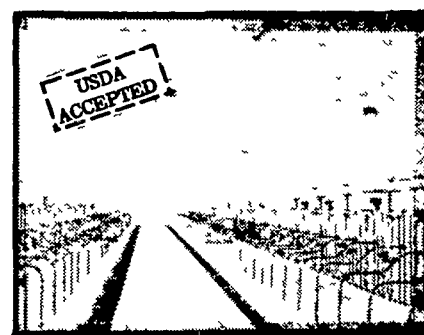
