Prices on slaughter steers and heifers advanced under the stimulating influence of an upward spiraling carcass trade. Most interests came into the period with minimal live inventories on hand and were in need of cattle for close up slaughter requirements. In addition, feeder buyers provided aggressive competition on fleshy two-way type 950-1100 lbs. steers suitable for a short turn in the feedlot. Best demand still centered on consignments predominantly 3 with weight not a major price-determining factor. There was some increase in the volume of Good and Choice shortfed new crop cattle, approximately 2200 head 900-1050 lbs. steers were returned to the country for further finish. Slaughter steers made up approximately 31 pct and heifers 35 pct. Cows comprised 10 pct and feeders 24

pct.


