

# Eileen Shull crowned Pa. Dairy Princess

CAMP HILL - Eileen Shull of Pipersville, Bucks County, was crowned the Pennsylvania Dairy Princess for 1979-80 at the recognition banquet and pageant held in conjunction with the All-American Dairy Show on Tuesday evening.

Eileen is a senior at Central Bucks High School where she is an active participant in the National Honor Society. She is a 4-H member and member of the Ski Club. She devotes a large portion of her time to music, participating in the choir, district chorus, varsity singers, English handbell choir, and madrigals. In her presentation she sang "The Farmer and Consumer should be Friends" created from a song in Rogers and Hammerstein's musical, "Oklahoma."

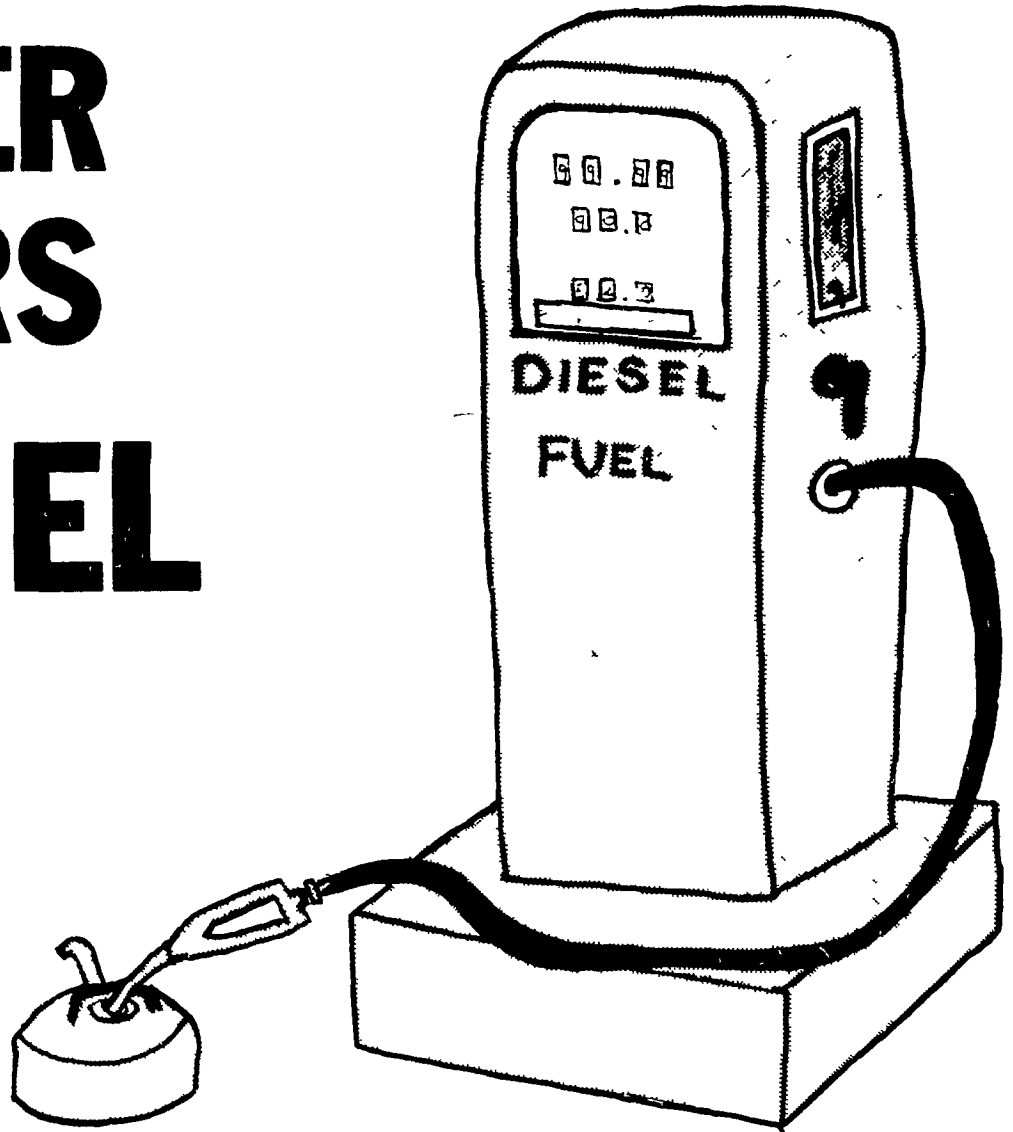
