DON'T LOSE YOUR WARRANTY

Warranties have come out of the dark ages in recent years. You no longer need a high powered telescope to read the fine print, because fine print is no longer allowed by law.

You don't need a law degree to interpret

warranties either. Warranties have to specify whether they're full or limited; they must clearly describe what is and what isn't covered. They must state the duration of the warranty and what you, the consumer, must do if you have a warranty claim.

In fact, one of the biggest

problems with warranties today is that consumers don't read them. They usually don't even think about them until the freezer breaks down or the range doesn't heat up or the sewing machine sews only what it chooses.

Then comes a hectic and often unsuccessful hunt for the warranty certificate. To complicate matters still further, many manufacturers require proof of date of purchase, such as a sales slip.

For peace of mind, establish a system whereby warranty certificates are filed right along with the appropriate sales slip. A manila envelope, a standard file folder, a section of a drawer or even an old shoe box will suffice.

DON'T VOID THE WARRANTY

Sometimes a product like a refrigerator, lawn mower, or food processor breaks down and the consumer

blames the manufacturer when the culprit is really consumer misuse.

This misuse can be inadvertent. For example, a few years ago many families had clothes dryers with clogged filters and other problems. Manufacturers refused to repair the appliances under the warranty. The reason? The problems were caused by use of an aerosol spray fabric softener, no longer on the market, rather than from any defect in the material or workmanship of the dryer.

It's unfair to expect manufacturers to repair products that fail due to our misuse or our failure to read the use and care materials the manufacturer provides with the product.

If we want manufacturers to honor their warranties, we should do our part by using the products as directed.

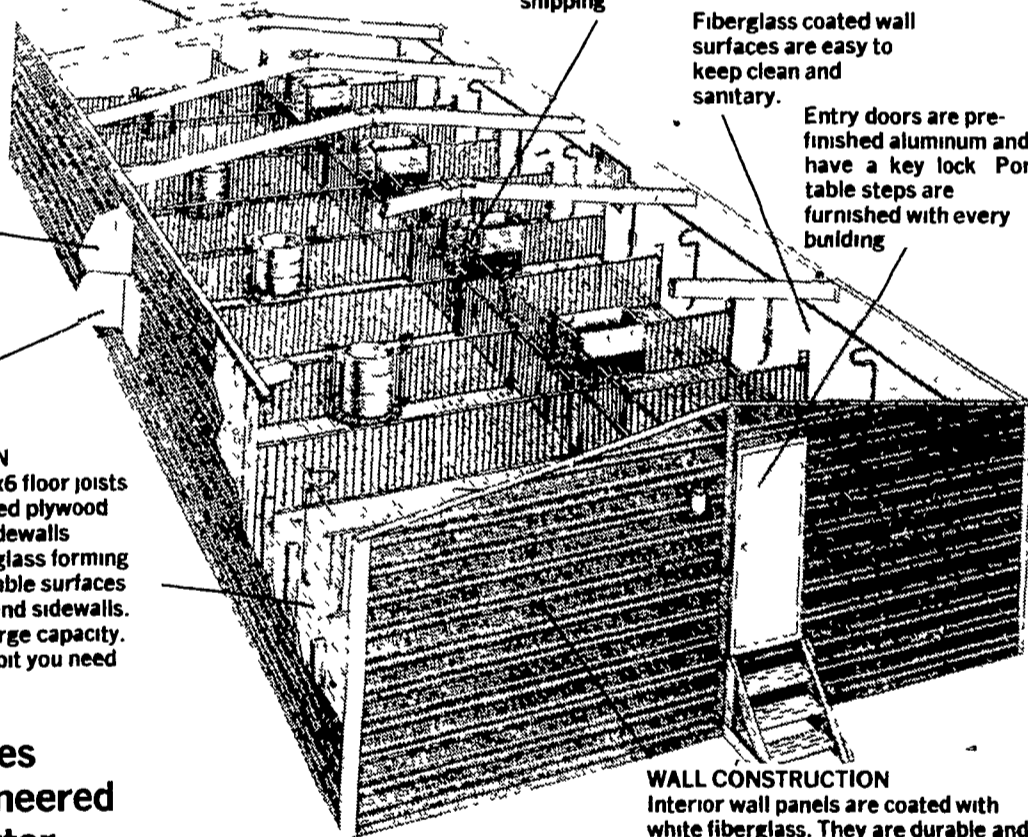

All electrical wiring and equipment meet strict codes, plumbing meets highest standards and both are tested thoroughly before shipping.

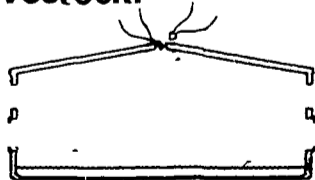
Fiberglass coated wall surfaces are easy to keep clean and sanitary.

Entry doors are pre-finished aluminum and have a key lock. Portable steps are furnished with every building.



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A Fresh air inlet is adjustable up or down by a hand crank. Fans and furnaces are controlled automatically to hold the comfort level needed.

B Ventilation is adjusted by the manager to control odors and moisture levels.

WALL CONSTRUCTION
Interior wall panels are coated with white fiberglass. They are durable and easily sanitized. Walls are filled with fiberglass insulation. The exterior is galvanized prepainted steel walls available in a wide range of colors.

C Air is pulled down through the manure pit and then out of the building by the fans. Odors are controlled because no air from the pit circulates in the building.

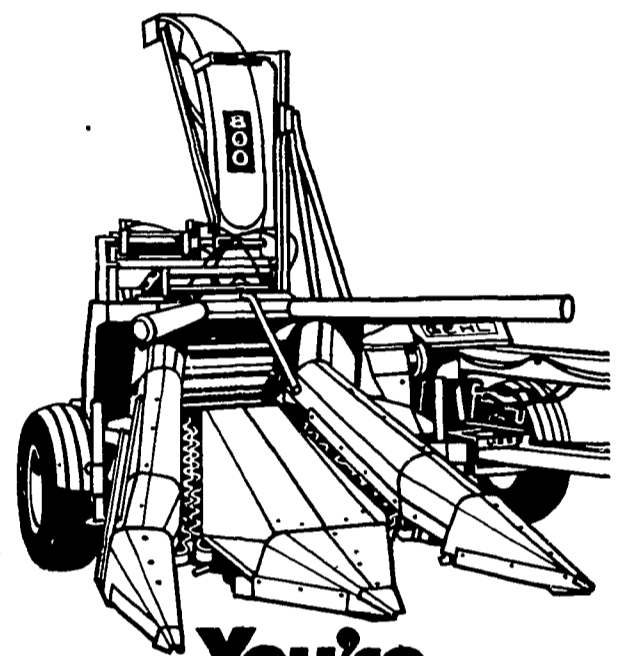
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
