

State urges licenses for hunting dogs

HARRISBURG — Small game season opens October 20 for fox, squirrels and ruffed grouse, to kick off this year's hunting in Pennsylvania fields and forests. State Agriculture Secretary Penrose Hallowell is urging hunters to license their dogs before going into the field.

"Every year, our Dog Law Officers receive hundreds of calls from hunters who have lost their dogs while in the field," Hallowell said. "Although many of these dogs are found by other sportsmen, many are never returned to their owners because they are not

licensed. Without a license, we have no way to trace a dog back to its owner."

Under the Pennsylvania Dog Law all dogs six months of age or older must be licensed. License fees are \$1.20 for males and spayed females, and \$2.20 for unspayed females.

Hallowell also said that hunters should be good sportsmen if they find a lost dog. "Check for the license tag on the dog's collar, and get in touch with the owner as soon as possible," he said. "Beyond the sentimental attachment a hunter feels

for his dog, the dog represents a lot of work and care to him."

The Agriculture Department, which enforces the state's Dog Law, is responsible for a variety of dog related problems. Don Moul, Director of the Bureau of Dog Law Enforcement, said that many dogs will take off and pursue a deer or other game animal. He

warned hunters to be careful to avoid destroying a dog which is after an animal. "If a hunter kills the dog, he may be liable for damages unless he can prove that the dog was endangering the life of a deer or other big game animal," Moul said. "A hunter who destroys a dog must report the killing to the owner or to a game protector within five days."
