USDA clarifies peach standards

WASHINGTON, D.C. -Internal defects in peaches, including broken or shattered pits, will affect the grade of peaches, said Eddie F. Kimbrell, deputy administrator for commodity services of the Food Safety and Quality Service, U.S. Department of Agriculture.

A notice published in the Federal Register is designed to clarify before the next growing season the department's position on defects that can lower the official U.S. grade of a peach.

The notice states that a broken pit is one of several defects that can affect grade but is not specifically listed in the grade standards. Other are moldly seed cavity, cold damage and sunburn.

Broken or shattered pits will contribute toward a lower grade to the extent that they detract from the appearance or eating or shipping quality of the peach, since the peaches would not meet the high quality standards required of a U.S. No. 1 fruit. The extent of defects from broken or shattered pits will be determined by sample cuttings from peach lots.

The department's Food Safety and Quality Service establishes grade standards and provides official grading for many food products. Use of the standards and grading services is voluntary.


