Health and Education, Irene Stem, Medford Grange, Chairman:

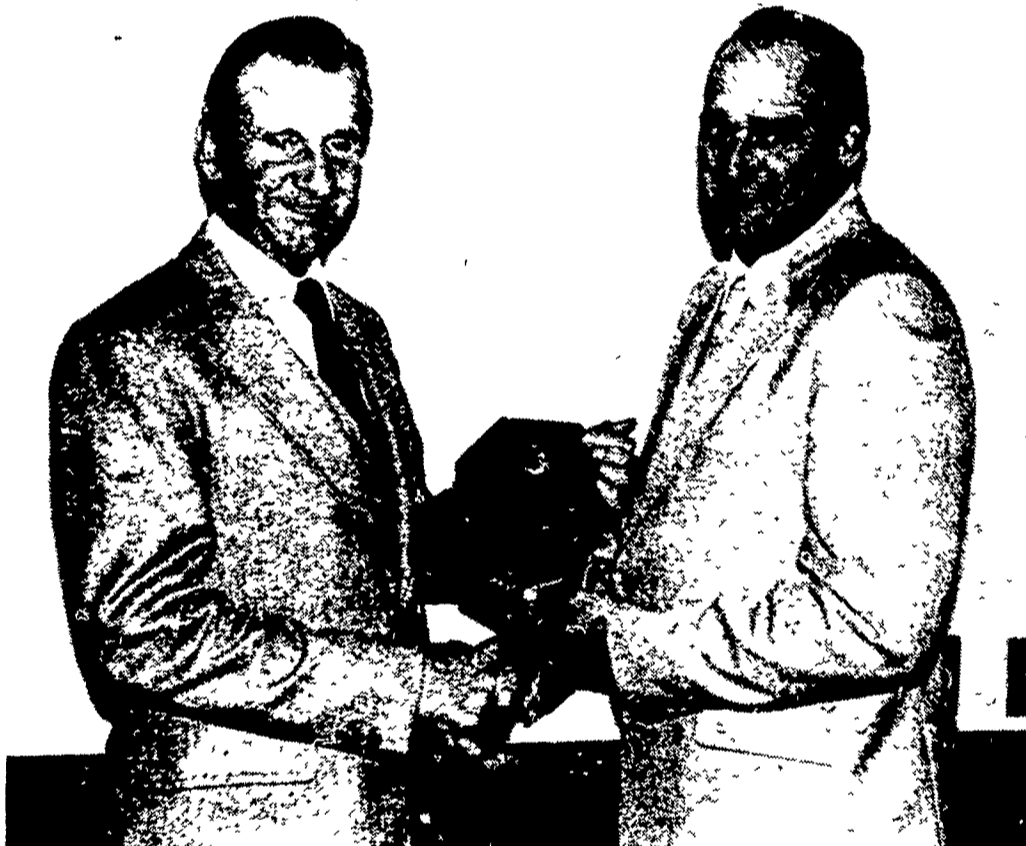
Favor full program of vocational agriculture education program.

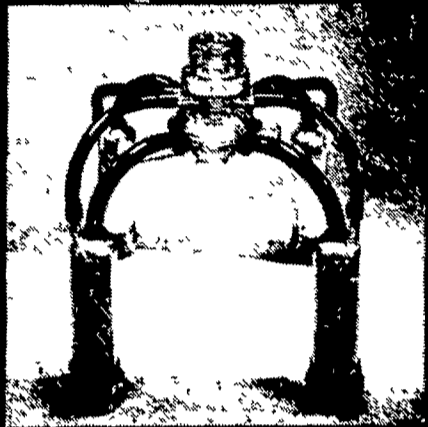
