The Ladies Lead class is a combination of modeling 100 percent wool garments and leading a purebred sheep at halter. The contestants are judged on a selection of garment, appropriateness of garment, poise, the quality of the sheep led, and the ability of the entrant to lead the sheep at halter. Sixteen contestants between the ages of 16 and 22 competed.

Miss Cerelli modeled a handmade 100 percent virgin worsted wool cornflower blue long-sleeve dress. The

classic ensemble was accented with black strap shoes, black gloves and a 100 percent wool felt hat and black scarf. Miss Cerelli led a Hampshire yearling ewe sponsored by Albert Wilson, Jr., of Rural Retreat, Virginia.

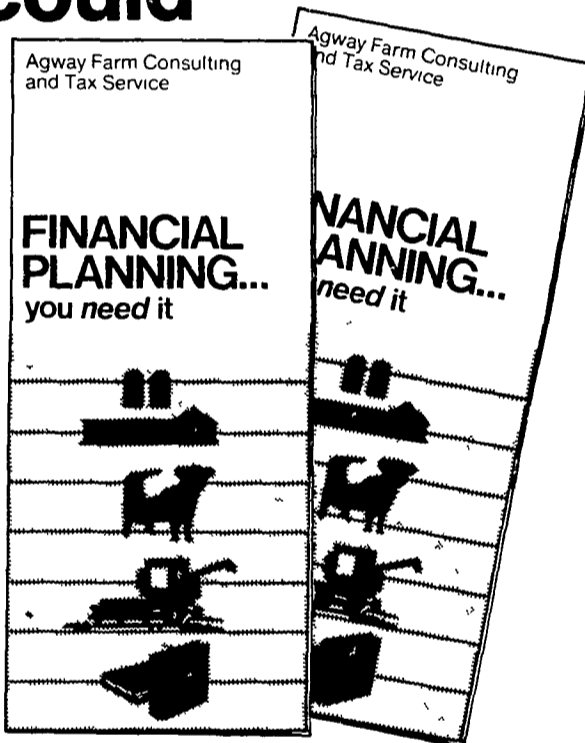
