

Fertilizer blenders set quality workshop

EPHRATA - A second dry-blend fertilizer quality workshop is being planned for Pennsylvania fertilizer processors on December 13 in Reading.

Representatives from several organizations have taken part in the planting - The Fertilizer Institute, the Inland Fertilizer Association, the Penn-

sylvania Department of Agriculture and PennAg Industries Association. The latter organization has assumed responsibility for the administration and registration.

Following last year's successful format, plans call for a classroom session and then a visitation to study an actual fertilizer blend plant.

Those attending this year will visit the Reading Bone Fertilizer Co.

The subject matter of the workshop will include some of the more practical and recent techniques in formulating high quality blend fertilizers. It will be planned

to appeal to operational as well as supervisory personnel.

"We feel confident that last year's success will insure an even greater attendance this year," Donald W. Parke, executive vice-president of PennAg Industries Association said.

"We are glad to be a part of this voluntary effort by the fertilizer industry in constantly improving the quality of its products."

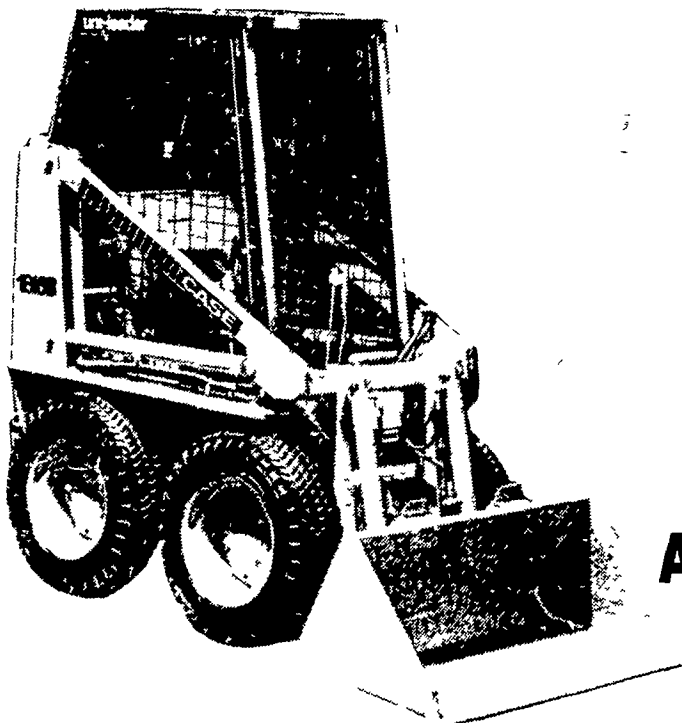

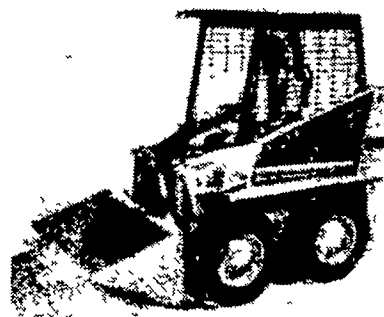
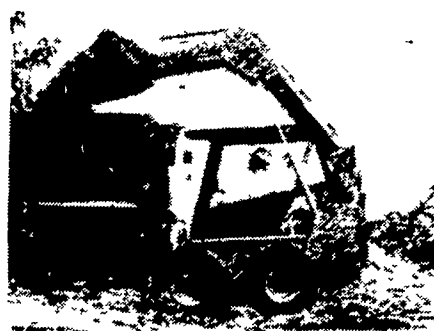
