

Eastern Bradford NEBA holds annual meeting

Chester Hale of Rome, R.D., Bradford County, retiring director of the Northeastern Breeders Association, reported the Association was enjoying its best financial year and that the sizeable improvements on buildings and grounds at NEBA headquarters were paid for from cash flow.

This report and others were heard by 70 farm family members at the 16th annual dinner meeting of the Eastern Bradford Local of NEBA held last week at the

North Orwell Community Hall.

William Brown, chairman of the local advisory committee, recognized two charter members, John Howard, Sr. and Harold Russell. He introduced Miss Penny Allen, Bradford County Dairy Princess, who extolled the value of drinking milk.

Robert Paar, local district manager from NEBA, spoke briefly telling that the success of NEBA and Sire Power was due to the performance of the technician.

He said Carl Remington, a local technician, was listed third among 65 in the "Top 15 Performance Category." The other technicians, Everett Cook, unit manager, Walter Abell, and Larry Swenson were also mentioned in the "Top 15".

Paar said there were 22,134 cows bred first service in Bradford County, 55% through the technician service, an increase over last year.

The main speaker was Dr. George Henning, veterinarian, a graduate of Pennsylvania State University, with a masters degree in reproductive physiology from the University of Wisconsin. His thesis was that the farmer, veterinarian, and insemination technician should work closely together toward the goal of getting cows bred, the number one problem of every dairyman.

The group selected William Brown, James Howard, and Jeff Hale for a two year term on the advisory committee to NEBA, Frances Davis, voting delegate, John Howard to the Holstein committee, and Robert Davis to the Guernsey committee.

Steve Neely, Sire Programs Consultant, narrated a series of slide pictures of current Sire Power Sires, and their offspring.

The meeting was adjourned after the awarding of many door prizes.

East Bradford Local is one of the many small groups comprising NEBA, a

cooperative covering several counties in northeastern Pennsylvania. Together with the Maryland Artificial Breeding Cooperative and West

Virginia Breeding Cooperative, NEBA owns Sire Power, Inc., a complete breeding service with headquarters in Tunhannock, Pennsylvania.

Southern States Co-op sets grain export meeting

FREDERICKSBURG, Va. — Grain producers in the mid-Atlantic area will be given a report on cooperatively-owned east coast grain export facilities at the annual meeting of the Grain Marketing Division of Southern States Cooperative. The meeting will be held December 3 at the Sheraton Motor Inn in Fredericksburg, Va.

James A. Layton, chief executive officer of Farmers Export Company, headquartered in Shawnee Mission, Kansas, will be the principal speaker. He will brief growers on the first year's operation of the Farmers Export terminal in Philadelphia, Pa., and on progress toward establishing one in the

Norfolk, Va., area.

Farmers Export Company is owned by 12 regional and inter-regional cooperatives engaged in the marketing of grain.

The grain marketing division of Southern States operates 10 grain receiving stations in Virginia, Maryland, Delaware and Kentucky and it handled a total of 21.7 million bushels, with a value of \$76.4 million, during the fiscal year which ended June 30. Comparable figures for the prior year were 18.7 million bushels and \$56.1 million.

Earnings after taxes came to \$644,200, up from \$164,600 the year before. This made possible a patronage refund to patrons of 3 cents for each bushel marketed through the division.
