## Environmental physiologist joins Del. poultry staff

NEWARK, Del. - Larry A. Cogburn has jomed the poultry research staff of the University of Delaware's department of anımal science and agricultural bochemistry as an avian environmental physiologist. He expects to concentrate primaruly on basic research into the effects of the physical environment especially temperature and
light - as they affect the metabolism (and thus the food needs) of the broiler chicken.
Cogburn, who calls his subject bionomics, says most of the basic work on poultry physiology to date has centered around the nutritional, rather than the environmental needs of the chicken. But with the trend towards total confinement in
the production of brollers there is a great need for such environmental research. Among other things, his work at Delaware could greatly enhance a program already under way in the department of agricultural engineering aimed at development of a computer energy model for broiler production.
So far the model concentrates on physical and nutritional (caloric) re quirements, because little physiological data on the chicken has been avaulable. Besides conductung basic research, Cogburn will also be doing some applied research concernung environmehtal responses of poultry as these relate to management. Most of his teaching in the college will be limited to graduate level instruction in poultry physiology.
Cogburn holds B.S. and M.S. degrees from North Carolina State University and a Ph.D. from the Univer

## Packer told to stop

## financial violations

NEW YORK, N.Y. - C \& C Livestock and Packers, Inc., a meat packer at Northwick, N.Y., and its president and owner, Alan S. Canter, of Holyoke, Mass., have been ordered ta stop violating financial and payment requirements of the Packer and Stockyards Act.
The meat packer purchases livestock for slaughter purposes throughout the northeastern United States and in Virginia.
The firm and Canter consented to the order and waived a hearing. They nether adroitted nor denied the charges in an administrative complaint filed by the U.S. Department of Agriculture.
The firm and Canter were ordered to cease and desist from:
--Purchasing livestock
while insolvent unless they pay the full purchase price of the livestock at the time of purchase;
-Failing to pay, when due, the full purchase price of livestock and meat;
-Failing to pay the full purchase price of livestock and meat; and
-Issuing insufficient funds checks in payment for iivestock.
The cease and desist order, like a permanent in junction, was issued to in sure future compliance with the P\&S Act.
Meat packers are required under the P\&S Act to maintain a solvent financial position and to pay promptly for livestock, unless credit has been arranged in advance. These are designed protection for the sellers of livestock.
