Compared to Tuesday's 4:30 report: No sales reported on Choice 3 steer beef, except weekly chain store buys; Y.G. 4 steer beef mostly 3.00 lower late. Choice heifer beef 2.00-3.00 lower late. Demand light, with buyers, particularly breakers, either off the market or bidding sharply lower. Packers making offers on moderate supplies but most unable to come to terms with bearish buyers. Reports indicate a moderate volume of chain store commitments with price to be determined near delivery date. Sales reported on 77 loads of steer and heifer beef.

WEEKLY 51 CATTLE: Midweek prices on slaughter steers were 50-1.00 lower, the greatest decline on consignments carrying substantial share yield grade 4. Heifers were mostly 50C lower. Cows closed firm to 50 cents higher and bulls were 1.00-3.00 higher.

Four day receipts 15,900; compared 11,700 three days previous holiday week; and 17,200 year ago.

Fed cattle prices came under rather persistent downward pressure following the Thanksgiving holiday as supplies expanded moderately and carcass prices turned sharply lower under generally light demand.

Yield grade was a major price determining factor as the differential between yield grade 3 and yield grade 4 carcasses widened to as much as 12.00-13.00 per cwt. The overall finish of the steer and heifer supply was attractive with a liberal percentage Choice and moderate volume Choice and Prime, although many consignments were mixed 3 and 4 yield grades. Feeder buyers were not aggressive

on two way steers as commodity board prices plunged sharply downward. Slaughter steers made up approximately 45 pct and heifers 30 pct. Cows contributed 10 pct and feeders 13 pct.


