Today's LTL asking prices held unchanged at 44-45 cents on plant grade and 45-46 cents on U.S. Grade A, though occasionally less aggressive than on Tuesday. Advance interest slow in developing. Live supplies ample at often very heavy weights. Undertone fully steady.

Current broiler/fryer negotiated prices for immediate delivery includes mostly multiple-drop shipments to New York City from Delmarva.

GNR eggs are classified by weight in 30-dozen cases, and traded in lots of either 300 or 750 cases. Prices are FOB buyers dock, and are computed Tuesday and Thursday of each week.
