Receipts this week 6,300: Week Ago 6,600 · Year Ago 7,000. Compared with last week close, slaughter steers fully steady, instances .50 higher. Slaughter heifers fully steady. Cows fully 5.00-6.00 lower. Bulls 1.00 lower Slaughter supply mainly Choice and Mixed Choice and Prime slaughter steers, around 35 percent heifers and 25 percent cows.

Note The supply of slaughter cows increased substantially, resulting in sharp price declines during the period.
