District will sponsor an educational meeting on beef cattle management on Tuesday evening, December 18, 1979, at 7:30 p.m. at the Union Grove School.

K.C. Williamson, Extension Beef Specialist from Virginia Polytechnic Institute in Blacksburg, Virginia, will speak on managing newly purchased feeder cattle, the new USDA feeder cattle grading system, and advantages and

precautions when buying Pre-conditioned feeder cattle.

Williamson will be of special interest to area cattle feeders since he helps to organize the graded feeder cattle sales throughout Virginia that many of our area feeders attend.

Williamson, former Virginia Cattleman of the Year Award recipient, is presently an Extension Livestock Specialist in beef cattle marketing. He has been an assistant County Agent in two Virginia counties, and is presently doing research on the effects of Pre-conditioning feeder cattle.

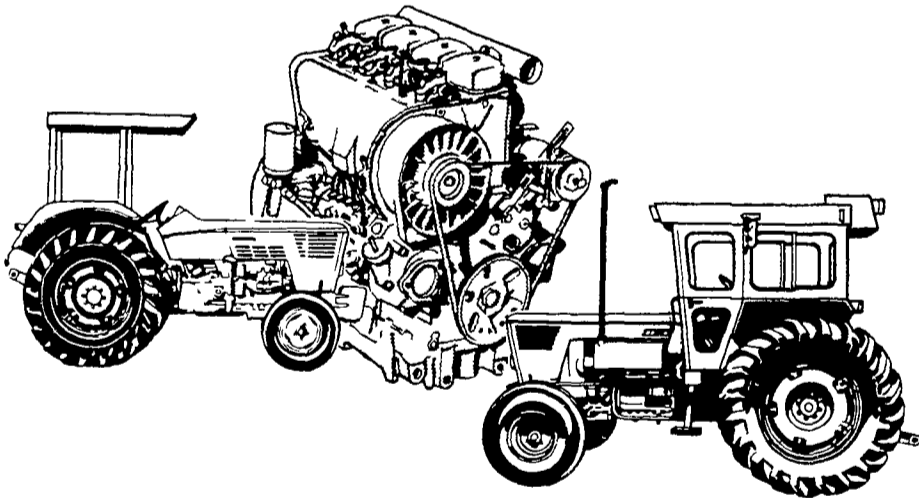
